Highmark Health

Highmark Health recognizes that to understand and impact health, we must consider that health includes physical, mental, and social health – our Living Health focus. Social factors shape a significant portion, as much as 80%, of one’s health before the health system can intervene. Factors such as food insecurity, transportation access, and housing insecurity, known as the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH), largely impact health and are not always addressed by the traditional health care system. SDOH factors play a big part in our overall wellness. Access to health care, healthy food, and important life resources impact our health beyond the care at a doctor’s office. Highmark Health is committed to addressing these factors because by understanding the impacts they have on individuals, we can better support patients’ and members’ overall health outcomes.

As the need for social services quickly rose at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Highmark and AHN launched the Community Support platform, a free tool that connects people seeking help with local nonprofits and services in their communities. This platform, powered by Aunt Bertha, is the largest and most widely used social care network in the country, offering access to geographically targeted resources such as food, housing, goods, transit, utilities, government benefits, education, work and legal services. Aunt Bertha is an electronic social service


resource (directory) and referral tool that assists people in finding social service providers nationwide.

The Community Support platform is simple to use. By entering your zip code and then typing a search term, or choosing from any of the offered categories, the Community Support platform will display available resources and services in your area. To further customize the search, you can also add filters, such as hours of availability, language, and distance to the agency.

For community-based organizations, the platform also offers the opportunity to list an organization’s programs and eligibility information for members of the community to easily connect and meet their needs. The platform also provides user-friendly access to managing your own program listings and access to team-related tools, reporting information and access to other community resources to better manage incoming referrals.

Auberle Career Pipeline Program

Auberle

The Auberle's Career Pipeline program helps young people that have experience with both juvenile justice and CYF to provide them access to career path employment opportunities.

Every participant completes the week-long Mental Toughness curriculum to begin developing the skills necessary to be successful in a professional environment. This, paired with ongoing soft skills training, assistance in the completion of any needed certifications and in-person training with our employer partners, ensures that participants are equipped to succeed in their new roles. Each participant will also receive individualized case management to assist them in navigating the various requirements of their chosen career path and certifications. This case manager will connect the client to Auberle's supportive services as needed and remain a resource even after placement in a job has been achieved to promote success in their long-term employment.

After completing the career training, many of the clients go on to secure positions with the companies where they trained. Our list of employer trainers and partners for this program is constantly expanding with our current list of partners including those in industries such as construction, nursing, outdoor maintenance, environmental remediation and auto mechanics. The Employment Institute continuously advocates for their clients by providing ongoing education to employer partners and ensuring that all certifications and job placements are criminal background friendly. The Career Pipeline program has proven to be a valuable resource in helping formerly incarcerated young people get the training they need to secure steady and rewarding employment.

The program directly assists participants with creating a detailed goal plan, obtaining a credit report to work on improving their credit, creating a monthly budget to increase knowledge of money management, creating, updating, and maintaining a current professional resume to improve success in obtaining employment opportunities, finding adequate affordable housing options, finding employment or better employment opportunities, and more. Self-Confidence through My Best Self Program

Auberle

The My Best Self Program at Auberle provides trauma-sensitive workshops that help young people heal from trauma, build confidence, practice self-care, and build resilience. Through tutorials and workshops, My Best Self Program engages young people around topics like haircare, personal hygiene and presenting a professional appearance. These things can seem superficial, but the program helps young people take pride in their appearance and then goes deeper to help them recognize what is holding them back from seizing the life they want. For youth facing significant personal challenges, it is an opportunity to identify their strengths and to apply them in productive ways.

The program provides in-person and virtual programming making it easy for young people to participate. Each week, My Best Self hosts programming via Auberle's 412 Youth Zone Facebook page as well as the My Best Self Facebook page, with topics spanning from positive affirmations to hair styling demonstrations to learning how to grow

through the experience of pain and difficulty in life. The program features interactive events such as virtual game nights and photo contests to help young people feel connected and engaged with a community. In addition to virtual programming, My Best Self offers workshops that help young people identify the trauma they have experienced and how they can begin to move forward in a positive way toward their goals. The functional workshops help participants to build self-confidence and promote personal hygiene which can often translate into an improved ability to gain and maintain employment and to let go of the things that are holding them back. The soft skills workshops help participants to learn strategies to manage stress, heal from the trauma, improve their ability to make positive decisions and celebrate the history and cultural power of Black hair.



needs, such as counseling, housing, clothing, and transportation.

When you complete your training, you may:

- Begin an apprenticeship in your chosen field.

The Goodwill LifeLaunch: Ignite Reentry Program is made possible with a \$4.5 million grant award from the DOL's Employment and Training Administration, covering 93 percent of operating costs, from the U.S. Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration. Goodwill Industries International and the four local Goodwill organizations included in this grant are contributing leveraged funding valued at \$324,762 to cover the remaining seven percent of operational costs.

The Pandemic One Year Later

Allegheny County Health Department

Over 60 years ago, Allegheny County created its own Health Department because the commissioners believed that it was important to provide local public health services to further protect and promote the health of our county residents. That focus has never been more important than it has in the past year.

March 14 marked the one-year anniversary of the first COVID-19 case in Allegheny County. Just a week later, the Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) announced the first COVID-related death. Now we have seen tens of thousands of cases, thousands of hospitalizations and are nearing 2,000 deaths from the coronavirus. We probably have all known someone who was impacted by the pandemic. Perhaps you, yourself, are part of those statistics.

In the very early days of the pandemic, ACHD was tasked with making certain that our community had enough testing. It wasn't easy, but through strong partnerships, we were able to quickly set up a mobile testing site that is still serving our county today. Testing continues to be an important component of our COVID response. On any given days, residents may seek testing at our site in McKeesport, or

may visit one of our mobile units, if they have symptoms or are a close contact of a case.

We have also encouraged everyone to continue doing what we know works. Our experience shows that we can reduce the threat of the virus by taking simple steps — wearing masks, remaining physically distant, and washing hands. You have heard it before, but it remains true. This is true even if you had the COVID vaccine.

Of course, as more and more people become vaccinated, we are beginning to move closer to some type of normal where we can even gather with those we love. But we must not let down our guard. Wearing masks, washing our hands, and remaining physically distant may still be our new norm until we learn more about the virus and the vaccine.

Importantly, for all of us, we have continued to share information and provide detail to the public on the virus, testing and the vaccine with public webpages which are frequently updated with the most up-to-date information. Turtle Creek Senior Center Updates

Eastern Area Adult Services

The Turtle Creek Senior Center is a program of Eastern Area Adult Services. In March of 2020, the Turtle Creek Senior center closed due to COVID-19 Pandemic. The Meals on Wheels program continued the delivery of weekly meals to the homebound seniors registered in the program; 52,773 meals have been delivered as of March 1, 2021. In April of 2020, the senior center started the Grab 'n Go meal pick up for all seniors registered at the center who were interested or in need of food; 7,252 meals have been distributed as of March 1, 2021. Wellness calls to 400 center and meals on wheels participants are done weekly along with a monthly newsletter mailing that provides information on different virtual classes and programs for the seniors to participate in. Even though the senior center has not been open to the public in over a year, service to the community has never stopped.



No opening date for the Turtle Creek Senior Center has been set, but the staff at the senior center is looking forward to welcoming everyone back in the future.

Many additional supports are offered, including assistance with childcare and transportation, GED classes, counseling, and connections to community resources. But most



Job Opening: Education Associate

Do you have the summers off and looking for a position to supplement your income while teaching and interacting with children? Do you want a job working with fantastic coworkers for a program that is a considered a model in the county? This position may be right for you!

The Human Services Center Corporation (HSCC) is currently seeking candidates for part-time temporary work in the KOOL Summer Program in Turtle Creek for low-income first-fifth graders which runs July 1-August 13, 2021 (closed July 5). You must possess current Act 33/34 and FBI clearances or at least start applying for them to be considered for an interview.

The HSCC is following all CDC recommendations and our procedures are considered "low risk". Small groups of students will stay together all day, each day. Participants will remain at least 6 feet apart

inside and will not share objects. Outdoor activities will be prioritized. Masks will be mandated to be worn at all times aside from meal times.

The Education Associates are responsible for overseeing a classroom of youth, developing and implementing math and reading lessons on a weekly basis, implementing an online academic curriculum, and planning lots of other activities daily, among other duties. High energy is needed – lots of time is spent outside and indoors playing with and supervising the participants. Hours are Monday-Friday, from 8:30AM-4:30PM. The pay is \$15/hour for 40 hours per week.
